In Council, July 2. 1822.

The Military Committee to whom was referred the petition of James Means and others inhabitants of the towns of Diamond and Etna and the plantation of Number five in the second Range, praying "that they, with such others as may join them, may be" "formed into a Company of Light Infantry, to be attached to the seventh" "Regiment, first Brigade of the third Division, with power to recruit the" "said Company from any other town within the said seventh Regiment, having" "due regard to the rights of the standing companies," ask leave to Report, That said petition is approved by the Brigadier General of said Brigade, and that, in the opinion of the Committee the prayer of the petitioners ought to be granted. And that the Governor and Commander in Chief be advised to cause an order to be issued raising and attaching said Company accordingly —
