In Council, July 6. 1822

The Committee of Council to whom was referred the Communication of Major General Samuel Fessenden of the fifth division, stating that, in his opinion, the Company of Cavalry, commanded by Captain Roland Holden, in the first Brigade of said Division, ought to be disbanded, having had the same under consideration, Report, that, on examining the return of said Company it appears the number is now, and for a long time past has been, much less than twenty. - The said Committee therefore recommend that the Governor and Commander ^{in Chief} be advised to cause an order to be issued disbanding said Company, and causing the men belonging thereto to be enrolled in the standing Companies within the bounds of which they respectively reside.
