The Committee of Council to whom was referred the communication of the Treasurer, requesting a Warrant for such sum as may be necessary to defray the expenses of removing the Ordnance and Military Stores, belonging to this State, from Boston to Portland, having had the same under consideration, Report, That, as the Legislature have made no specific appropriation to defray these expenses, it is expedient that an advance, partially sufficient therefor, be made out of the Contingent fund, appropriated by the resolve of the month of February 1822.

They therefore recommend that the Governor be advised to draw his Warrant on the Treasurer of State, in favor of Albion K. Parris, for the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, for the purposes aforesaid, and to be charged to said appropriation; for the expenditure of which he is to be accountable. —
