At the Supreme Judicial Court begun & held at Augusta, within and for said County of Kennebec, on the first Tuesday of June (being the third day of said month) Anno Domini 1823.

State ~ v ~ Susan Dearborn, Larceny from Dwelling house. And now the said Susan Dearborn, is set to the bar and has this Indictment read to her, she says that thereof she is not guilty &c. a Jury is thereupon impanelled & sworn to try the issue to wit, Joseph Chinnell, appointed Foreman and fellows namely Percival Andrews, James Walsh, Rufus Berry, Lewis P. Bailey, John Drake, Green Drake, Daniel Gould, Jacob Graves, Francis Hubbard, John Morrison and Hanson Whitehouse; who after hearing all matters and things concerning the same return their verdict therein and upon oath say that the said Susan Dearborn is guilty. It is therefore considered by the Court here, that the said Susan Dearborn be punished by solitary imprisonment for the term of one month and afterwards that she be compelled to hand labor for the term of one year and that this sentence be executed upon her in and within the State of and in this County and that she now be committed in execution of this sentence
