STATE OF MAINE.

In Council, July 22, 1841.

The Standing Committee on WARRANTS, to which was referred the account of Gilman Turner late Superintendent of the Public Buildings, having carefully examined said account, Report, that they find the amount well vouched & correctly cast, and that there is due said Turner, the sum of one hundred forty four dollars & one cent, for so much money by him expended since January 3^d 1841, in the purchase of furniture & in making repairs in the Public Buildings—

The Committee therefore recommend, that the Governor be advised to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of State, in favor of said Turner, for the said sum of one hundred forty four dollars & one cent, to be paid out of the money appropriated for the repair of the Public Buildings & purchase of furniture, agreeable to an Act of July 20, 1841, which sum when so paid, will be in full of the amount referred as aforesaid,
