**HOMEMAKERS' COLUMN.**

Pass-It-On Hints.

OVEN TEST

To test the heat of an oven, place a piece of white paper in it, and if the heat is too great the paper will turn black; if it turns a light yellow it is fit for sponge cake and the light kind of biscuit; if a dark brown, it is fit for pastry, and if it turns a dark yellow it is ready for the baking of the heavier kinds of cake.

TO CLEAN REED BASKETS

A good way to clean reed baskets, which are widely used and which collect dust, is to use a small paint brush dipped in any of the cleaning oils now on the market for dusting. In this way all dust can be removed and the baskets will look like new.

SAVE YOUR CHEESE

Do not throw away cheese which has become hard and dry, but grate it and mix with enough cream to moisten. This, seasoned properly, makes delicious filling for pies or sandwiches.

KEEPING HAIR RIBBONS SMOOTH

Take four or five pieces of cardboard five inches long by two inches wide, cover with ribbon of a pretty color, and keep your hair ribbons wound around these. When you go to use your ribbons they are as unwrinkled as if just pressed. These also make pretty, as well as inexpensive gifts.

SHINE UP YOUR FAUCET

Nickel faucets can be made to look like new if polished with an old woolen cloth which has been dipped first in turpentine and then in whiting. Apply with a fair amount of elbow grease and the faucet will look like silver.

A VACATION PILLOW

When away on a vacation one always needs a pillow of some sort to sit on out of doors, yet cannot spare room for it in a trunk.

This difficulty may be overcome by taking a square pillow case made of denim or chamois, and while away fill it with hay and sweet fern and bayberry leaves.

When you go on the rocks by the shore or into the woods you have a pillow that is light to carry and sweet smelling. It also perfumes the room and it is nice to sleep on it at night. When it loses its scent or becomes damp or soiled it can be easily renewed.

When ready to return to the city, simply shake out the contents, fold up the case and pack it in your trunk.

If a stitched strap of the cloth is sewed into the seams on two sides it makes a very convenient handle, much appreciated if there is much walking to be done.

FOR A TIMID BABY

If baby cries and objects to his tub, teach the following plan will gently cure him of this habit. Place him in the tub on a dry cloth, and pour the water gently and slowly in the tub with no splash or splashing noise. Use but very little water the first time and increase from day to day until the right amount is gained. I have never known this treatment to fail of good results.

TO MEND SCREENS

Take a square of wire netting two inches larger than the hole; ravel out the wire on all sides one-half inch deep; bend the fringed end at right angles and push through the screen around the hole; then press the ends flat.

NEW SINKS FOR OLD

Clean sink or tubs thoroughly, then clean again with sal soda or ammonia water. Wipe out and let dry. Then apply a thick coat of glue, such as is used in sizing. Let this glue dry thoroughly, then apply two coats of good white paint, letting one coat dry before putting on the next. Sandpaper lightly, dry several days before using. This makes a good wearing, good looking tub or sink.

A MAKE-BELIEVE FOR BABY

After baby was two years old, he could not be induced to take his milk at meal-time. I now give him a glass of milk and put a lemonade straw in it, and have him sip it thus. He is delighted with the idea, making believe it is soda water, and it is a means of having him take it slowly.

LEFT-OVER PIE DOUGH

When making pie, roll the left-over pie dough very thin, then cut it out with the lid of a syrup can so it will fit in your gem pans, line the pans with the dough and crimp the edges with the tines of a silver fork and place in the oven and bake. Keep these ramekins in a tin box if they are not to be used at once. They make delicious individual pies when filled with fruit or custard and baked.

A LITTLE LESS DARNING TO DO

Paste pieces of velvet, soft side up, into the heels of your shoes, bottom and back, and you will find your stocking darning reduced by a big percent.

FLY PAPER AND THUMB TACKS

When the wind whips that sheet of sticky fly-paper right over on to your best white table cloth, and then if you will tack the fly paper to a thin board, with glass thumb tacks, you will have no more trouble.

A WHITE STOCKING HINT

A teaspoon of turpentine in the last rinsing water will keep your white silk stockings from turning yellow when washed.

Rules for Cooking Green Vegetables.

The cleaning and preparation of green vegetables count for as much as the cooking itself. They must be properly ripened and fresh from the garden. Wilting vegetables, if not stale, may be restored by crisping in ice-water for an hour or two. Every particle of dirt or decayed matter should be removed. A brush for scrubbing saves hands and labor. Special cutters are attractive, but not necessary.

Carrots and turnips should be sliced, or cut into long, thin "strings." Beets are simply washed, without breaking the skin, and four or five inches of the green stem should be left on. They may be cut as desired, after cooking. When tender, cook the green tops, too, as you would spinach, and use for garnishing the dish. Cabbage should be shredded, then simmered gently for 20 minutes, without a cover. The success of spinach depends on the washing and final fine chopping and seasoning; beans, on the proper stringing and cutting, longwise rather than across. Peas and corn are only good when fresh. Peas should have a pod or two boiled in the water with them; corn should have the husks and silk left on. Both should be timed carefully; over-cooking is disastrous. About 20-30 minutes for peas; 10-15 minutes for corn.

1. All vegetables should be put on in boiling water. The boiling should continue gently until the vegetable is tender—no longer. Rapid boiling or over-cooking spoils color, flavor, making many vegetables tough. A cover is not necessary; it should never be used for onions, cauliflower or cabbage.

2. Top-ground vegetables should be cooked in salted water. Underground vegetables should be salted after cooking.

3. The very water vegetables—squash, spinach, beet-tops—should be cooked over steam, or in a pan with very little water.

Notes.

Experience at first hand sometimes comes pretty dear. Don't be above making use of someone's else.

When the seats of your wicker chairs begin to sag, wet them thoroughly on the under side and turn them upside down in the sunshine to dry. They will shrink back into place.

A cloth wrung lightly from kerosene and hung out to air until the odor has evaporated makes an excellent dust cloth. A little raw linseed oil added to the kerosene makes it better.

Use the sewing machine for mending whenever possible. It is so much quicker and hand work and even patching may be done neatly on it. Pin the patch carefully, sew, turn edges under on right side and sew again.
