In Council, March 7. 1825.

The Standing Committee on Military affairs, to whom was referred the petition of James W. Puley and Benjamin Webber, representing that a tract of land, called the Academy Grant, in the County of Oxford and adjoining Batchelders Grant, so called, on the South, contains about twelve male inhabitants, who, were they situated within the bounds of any company, would be obliged to perform Military duty: They, therefore, pray that the said Inhabitants, residing on said Academy Grant, may be attached to the Company of Militia in the town of Lovell and required to do duty therein, having had the same under consideration Report: That, in the opinion of the Committee, for the reasons set forth in the said petition the prayer thereof ought to be granted: The Committee, therefore, recommend that the Governor be advised to cause an order to be issued whereby the Inhabitants, liable to be perform Military duty, residing on the tract of land aforesaid, shall be attached to the Standing Company of Militia in said town of Lovell, and held to perform military duty therein
