To the Governor & Council —

The petitioners respectfully represent, that a tract of land, called the Academy Grant, in the County of Oxford & adjoining Batchelders Grant, so called, on the South, contains about twelve male inhabitants, who, were they situated within the bounds of any company, would be obliged to perform military duty — They therefore pray that the said inhabitants, residing on said Academy Grant, may be attached to the company of Militia in the town of Lovell & required to do duty therein.
