The Standing Committee on the Pay Roll of the Council, Report: That the whole amount of pay for travel and attendance of the *first* Session of the *Twenty first* Council, which commenced on the *nineteenth* day of *January* and ended on the *twentieth* — day of *April 1841*, is *twelve hundred eighty nine* — dollars, and that the pay of the Messenger during the same time, is *one hundred eighty* dollars, amounting in the whole to *fourteen hundred sixty nine* — dollars. The Committee recommend therefore that the Governor be advised to draw his Warrant on the Treasurer of State in favor of the persons therein named, and for the several sums therein specified. To be charged to and paid out of the appropriation made for the payment thereof under the Act of *July 20th* A. D. 1841.
