In Council June 24. 1841

The Standing Committee on Warrants, to which was referred the Accounts of William Wourt Jr., Post Master at Augusta, for Postage of Letters, to Edward Kent, Governor, four dollars 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; for Postage of letters to Samuel P. Benson, Secretary of State, forty five dollars 56 $\frac{1}{4}$ cents; for Postage of letters to Sanford Kingsbury, Treasurer of State, forty seven dollars 73 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; for Postage of letters to Isaac Hodsdon, Adjutant General, twenty dollars 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ cents, have had the same under consideration, and Report: That the Governor be advised to draw his Warrant on the Treasurer of State, in favor of said Wourt, for the sum of One hundred and seventeen dollars and eighty one cents, in full for said accounts; to be charged to and paid out of the appropriation for Postage, under the act of Feb'y 20. 1841
