The Committee of Council to whom were referred the accounts of Abram Osgood and Dyer and Bond, having had the same under consideration, Report:—

That the said Osgood has charged the sum of one hundred and twenty seven dollars and twenty seven cents for ~~and~~ ^{performed} labour, and materials, ~~performed and~~ ^{furnished} furnished, in erecting a fence, enclosing the arsenal, and sundry other labor and materials, not embraced in the contract for erecting said building; ^{or any amount heretofore allowed} and that the said Dyer and Bond have charged the further sum of twenty dollars and seventeen ^{cents} for labor in whitewashing the walls of said building; & that the Agent for erecting said building has certified that said ^{services have been per} accounts are just and reasonable. The Committee, therefore, recommend that the Governor be advised to draw his Warrant ~~in favor of the said Osgood~~, on the Treasury of this State, in favor of the said Osgood, for the said sum of one hundred and twenty seven dollars and twenty seven cents, & also his other Warrant in favor of the said Dyer & Bond for the said further sum of twenty dollars and seventeen ^{cents}, in full for the charges contained in said accounts, to be paid out of the appropriation for the payment of the Contingent expenses of the Current year, under the Resolve of the 25th of February last.
