In Council, July 21. 1823

The Committee of Council to whom were referred the returns of votes for a Representative in the Congress of the United States, from York District, having carefully examined the same Report:— that the whole number of votes returned from all the towns in said District is two thousand four hundred and twenty one; necessary to make a choice one thousand two hundred and eleven; and that, as no one person has that number of votes, no choice has been effected:— The Committee further Report: that it appears, by the returns aforesaid, that the following persons were voted for, and had the number of votes set against their respective names, to wit: William Barleigh, one thousand and seven; Isaac Lane, eight hundred ten; Rufus McIntire, five hundred and one; John McDonald, thirty two; Edward P. Hayman, twenty five; Thomas G. Thornton, ten; Benjamin Greene, ^{eight}; Eliza Shepley, six; Col. Lane, three; Samuel Fox, two; George W Wallingford, one; John Hall, Junior, one; Philip Hall, one; Abner Saurer, Junior, one; Henry Woodman, one; Thomas Sande, one; James Kimball, one; James Ayer, Junr. one; George Wallingford, one; Henry B. C. Greene, one; Lane Isaac, one. & "Scattering" six.
