In Council, October 20, 1841.

The Standing Committee on Military affairs, to which was referred the application of Colonel Louis Morrill, of the Third Regiment, Second Brigade and Ninth Division, for the rescinding the order of Council of Nov 23. 1840, by which a company of Infantry was formed in the town of Amity and in the Gore called Orient, have had the same under consideration and Report. That for the reasons set forth in said application they would recommend that so much of the Order of Council of November 23. 1840, as relates to the forming of the company of Infantry in the town of Amity and Orient's Gore, be rescinded, and that the persons liable to do military duty, residing in Amity, be annexed to and compose a part of the A Company of Infantry in the town of Hoagdon, in the Regiment Brigade and Division aforesaid; and that the Governor and Commander in Chief be advised to cause an order to be issued to carry this purpose into effect.
