In Council April 30. 1824

The Committee to whom was referred the Resoln of the Legislature "providing for the education of the Deaf and Dumb," passed the 25th day of February last, having had the same under consideration  
Report.

That, in their opinion, it is not expedient to adopt any measures, under said Resoln, to establish a school in this State, until the Council have further information of its practicality; that such information can be best obtained by an examination of institutions similar to that contemplated in the Resoln, from which examination the Council will be made more particularly acquainted with the difficulties to be overcome, and the measures proper to be adopted:—

The Committee, therefore, recommend that one of the Representatives of this State in Congress be requested to examine the American Asylum at Hartford, and report such facts as will enable the Council to decide whether it is practicable to establish such an institution in this State as is provided for in said Resoln.
