COLBY'S NEW PRESIDENT.
The trustees of Colby University met in Portland Saturday and elected Rev. R. L. Whitman of Portland to be President of Colby in place of Dr. Small who recently resigned. Mr. Whitman was born in the Province of Massachusetts parents. He is graduated from Newton Theological Seminary two years ago and settled over the Free Street Baptist church where he has shown great ability. A committee from a Cleveland, Ohio, church offered him a salary of six thousand dollars to go there. Mr. Whitman chose to accept the presidency of Colby at \$500.

COUNTY POLITICS.
County Attorney Edward C. Walker of Lovell is to remove soon to Bridgton in Cumberland County which takes him out of the field as a candidate before the Republican county convention. The candidates for county attorney will be E. F. Smith, Esq., of Norway, and John S. Harlow, Esq., of Bethel. Both are rising young lawyers of excellent ability and character. Both are at present honored with the chairmanship of the board of selectmen of their respective towns. Both will have a strong support in the convention and the nomination and election of either will give the county an official in this important office who will do his duties fearlessly and well.

The impression having gone out that Mexico is the home of Albert D. Park, Esq., who will contest the nomination for register of probate with Herrick C. Davis, Esq., of Paris, and Jesse W. Warren, Esq., of Waterville, we would correct the error. Mr. Park bought property in Hartford three years ago and makes his home there. He is a member of the Republican Town Committee of Hartford.

A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.
Little attention has so far been paid to the fact that by a resolve of the last legislature, the following constitutional amendment will be submitted to the voters of Maine next September:

No person shall have the right to vote or be eligible to office under the constitution of this State, who shall not be able to read the constitution in the English language and write his name, provided, however, that the provisions of this amendment shall not apply to any person prevented from doing so by physical disability or from complying with its requisitions by any person who now has the right to vote or to any person who shall be sixty years of age or over at the time this amendment shall take effect.

The platform adopted by the Prohibition state convention last week endorses this amendment, and it is not likely to encounter any organized opposition. Of course no limitation of the suffrage should be made except for good cause; but the ignorant voter is a dangerous element in our political system. The educational qualification prescribed by the amendment is a very simple one, and with the standard of education which prevails in Maine, cannot deprive any large number of citizens from the privilege of voting. It will be noticed that it does not apply to any person who is now a voter, nor to any one over thirty years of age at the time of the adoption of the amendment.

POLITICAL NEWS AND NOTES.
The state convention of the People's Party of Maine assembled in the city hall at Gardiner on Tuesday. Some less than 100 delegates were present, including several prominent labor men. John Chase took a prominent part in the proceedings. L. C. Batesman of Searsville was nominated for governor. The resolutions demand the free coinage of silver, a graduated income tax, the suppression of all trusts and combinations, government control of railroads and telegraphs, the listing system of taxation, an eight-hour day for laborers, equal suffrage, regardless of sex, the suppression of the saloon, and a few other minor points.

The state convention of the Prohibition party was held in Bangor Thursday. Rev. George M. Park of Presque Isle acted as chairman. Timothy B. Hussey of North Berwick was nominated for governor.

The first District Republican convention met in Portland Wednesday, and was a harmonious affair. Charles F. Libby of Portland and C. M. Moses of Saco were chosen delegates to the Maine convention, and John E. Warren of Westbrook and George Goodwin of Wells were chosen alternates.

There was quite a heated discussion in the United States Senate over the alleged corruption of the Maine Senators, appropriating \$100,000 to entertain the G. A. R. encampment. The division of the senatorial minds on this constitutional question did not show any political party line, but sectional lines were marked. No Northern Senator voted against the appropriation. With the exception of the two Maine Senators, the two Delaware Senators, and Fulkner of West Virginia, no Southern Senator voted for the appropriation. Mr. Thurston of New Jersey voted for it. Yet the Northern Democrats are generally supposed to share with the Southern brethren the dread of the Maine Senators, and are suspected of being in the constitutional.
