THE UNPROMISING END.  
The verdict of the coroner's jury in the recent  
disaster case in Portland conveys  
very little meaning at the first reading.  
A second reading translates it into  
"don't know, but think so." It is a  
blame." To be sure, they pronounce  
construction faulty as to the overhead  
pipe, but they are careful to effect to

Governor Lowell of Kansas, the  
Populist who has already achieved some

condition aimed at. The only governor  
who favored the scheme was Penoyer  
of Oregon and Stone of Missouri. Penoyer  
is a man who has on several  
occasions demonstrated that he had an  
aggravated idea of the importance of his  
position. No matter how much Mr. Governor  
Stone of Missouri should express himself  
in favor of such an impossible scheme.

The prospect for unconditional repeal  
of the Sherman law is generally under  
stood to be considerably better than it  
was at the time congress met. It has  
been conceded that it was not the  
house, but until recently it was thought  
that it would fall of a passage in the  
senate. Now, however, it is thought  
likely that it will pass the senate as well.
