The undersigned Agt of the Penobscot Indians would respectfully represent, that in purchasing seeds for the Indians & preparing lands occupied by them for crops, together with Spring dividend of Provisions and small sums expended & to be expended, weekly for Widows & other poor who are not in a situation to procure their own subsistence will require as per Schedule, (Estimated)
