## PROCLAMATION

State of Maine

AN ACT to Authorize the Issuance of Bonds in the Amount of Six Million Dollars on Behalf of the State of Maine to Build State Highways.

WHEREAS, the One-hundredth Legislature of the State of Maine by an act entitled, "AN ACT to Authorize the Issuance of Bonds in the Amount of Six Million Dollars on Behalf of the State of Maine to Build State Highways," passed by a concurrent vote of both branches and approved June 17, 1961, which said act is known and identified as Chapter 203 of the Private and Special Laws of 1961, enacted said measure expressly conditioned upon the people's ratification by a referendum vote, at the next general or special state-wide election, and

WHEREAS, such a special state-wide election was duly called and held on the second Tuesday of October, 1961, which date was set forth in Chapter 220 of the Private and Special Laws of 1961, and

WHEREAS, it appears by the return of votes given in by the electors of the various cities, towns and plantations voting upon said act upon the tenth day of October, 1961, and canvassed by the Governor and Council on the eighteenth day of October, 1961, that a majority of said votes were in favor of this act becoming a law; namely, 29,511 for, and 11,554 opposed;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, John H. Reed, Governor of the State of Maine, in pursuance of the provisions of the Constitution of said State in such cases provided declare said measure adopted, to take effect and become a law thirty days from the date of this proclamation.
