MEETING OF OXFORD DISTRICT LODGE AT

PARIS HILL—FULL REPORT OF THE MEETING

STANDING DELEGATION FROM SOUTH

day, June 10th. Bro. Eastman was Dis-

trict Master for last year, but as the

presenting officer had not been in

office, he officiated in his stead.

Mrs. Geo. A. Wilson of South Paris

was appointed District Vice Temples;

Geo. H. Watkins, Secretary; Mrs.

Ken, Treasurer; Rev. S. Hooper of So

Paris, Chaplain; A. B. Chase, Con-

sultor; H. N. Bolster, Paris Hill, Past

Master; Capt. Lewis Spaulding, Mar-

shall; Mrs. Lucy Spaulding, Deputy

Master. This filled the offices and the

opening exercises began.

A. S. Austin, Esq., and Rev. Robert

Scott were appointed to fill vacancies

Records of the last session prepared by

the Secretary, Sharon Robinson, Jr., were

read and approved.
