ALBANY BASINS.

Upon a beautiful morning of last week, a party of boarders at the Pice Grove House, South Waterford, consisting of Charles A. Bartlett, wife and daughter, Mr. Whitmarsh and sister, took a team for the far-famed Albany Basins; and, by invitation of the driver, Thomas Brown, I gladly contracted the opportunity to view that curious rock of nature which has drawn so many tourists from all parts of the country to see. Our road led us by Bear Pond—where the water is so clear and blue as to be like a mirror at the foot of Bear Mountain, whose rocky base, composed of huge granite boulders which have been tumbled by ice masses and sum-

mit have, by man's restless energy, been converted into an excellent highway. The westerly side of this mountain, next to the pond, presents a singular appearance. The rocks and the lightnings have split and riven the granite into huge fragments, looking to the passer-by as if a small force, such as a wind or a wave, had been at work below. In one place there is a mass of granite which is almost a perfect pattern of a Swiss cottage, and has received that name from the curious and strange in nature.

About a mile and a half from the Grove, we passed South Waterford village—or the "City," as it is called—for what reason it has received that name is among the forgotten things of the past. It is a long, rambling village, built upon both sides of the road, and the houses are of various styles of architecture. The water is very good water-power at this place, and was at one time used as the motive power for a large and thriving business.
