Pondsset Co Court of County Commissioners April Term A. D. 1833 - And now the Court on examination of said account, do find the charges for support of prisoners in said Gaol unable to support themselves, confined by due process of law, on charge or conviction of crimes & offences, against the State, from the twelfth day of December 1832 to the 2nd day of April 1833 inclusive, amount to the sum of fifty seven dollars and forty one cents, and that the said Prisoners have not been able to pay any part thereof. Whereupon it is ordered that the same be allowed paid out of the County Treasury, & charged to the State, agreeable to the Statute in such case provided.
