Kennebec ss. Court of County Commissioners April Term A.D. 1833. —

Thomas Nickerson, under keeper of the States Gaol for said County, having exhibited his account aforesaid for supporting prisoners confined therein, from the eighteenth day of April to the first day of May A.D. 1833, upon Charge or conviction of crimes or offences against the State, and it having been found by the Court that said charges amount to six dollars; and that said prisoners have been unable to pay any part thereof: It is therefore ordered that said sum be allowed and paid to said Nickerson by the County Treasurers, and charged to the State.
