The undersigned Agent appointed under
 the Resolue of Maine, of Feb. 21st. 1824, to collect & adjust certain old claims, in this State, assign^d.
 by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to Maine, & to cause the proceeds thereof, to be paid
 into the Treasury - Submits the foregoing account & statements, marked Schedule, A. & B, as
 the result of his investigation of the Records, proceedings, Collections & payments, so far, as he
 has been able, as yet, to accomplish the business - The Agent is satisfied, there are
 further & considerable sums due, in some of the Counties; but it is doubtful, whether much
 can ever be realized, arising to the death, removal, or total insolvency, of most of
 the debtors, there is no prospect of anything being collected, in the Counties of Washington,
 Oxford & Somerset, some further, small sums, may be collected, in Hancock, Kennebec & Lincoln,
 in York, nothing, as yet, has been rec^d. - In Cumberland & Lincoln, there are some
 equitable claims, as yet, unadjusted, tho every exertion has been made, (without resorting
 to suits, which has not been deemed advisable), to bring these old claims to a close - To
 facilitate the object, after examining the Cases, those thought worth consideration, extracts were
 made & placed, in the hands of the respective County Judges - It appeared, however, on critical exam-
 ination, that many of the balances reported, by the Committee, as due, were settled &
 paid the Treasury of Massachusetts, prior to the separation, & many other
 claims reported, are without any legal foundation -

The Agent has examined many hundred Cases, & spent much time &
 labor, in the investigation, and regrets, not being able to exhibit, a more fa-
 -vourable result, it is presumed, however, not much was expected from such a
 mass of dubious demands - He feels much confidence, still, that something further
 will be eventually collected, in Cumberland, Lincoln & Hancock -
