The first five items of the foregoing account were satisfactorily vouched for. For the charge of wood to Tupper the following.

Bangor June 16th 1828

At the request of Mr. Call we state that

Last Fall several families of Indians encamped near the lines of our Woodland in Bangor they remained there ten days or a fortnight, during which time they cut young trees and damaged the growth more than we would have had done for Twenty dollars. We called on Mr. Call to remove them and pay the damage he caused them to remove but has not paid any damage. We believe they removed on to land that he owned and of which he has the care and which adjoins ours, and we state that we should think it worth more than ten dollars to suffer a family to encamp furnish themselves with wood on our lands for a winter.
