In Council June 24, 1839.

The Standing Committee on Warrants, to which was referred the accounts of Jeremiah Godwin, Treasurer of State, and Philip C. Johnson, - having examined the same, Report; That the said Godwin has charged six hundred dollars for the purchase of Standard Balances for the use of the State, and that the said Johnson has charged thirty eight dollars and fifty cents, for Cases and other necessary appendages for said Balances, and for which they have produced satisfactory vouchers. - They therefore recommend that the Governor be advised to draw his Warrants on the Treasurer of State, one in favor of the said Jeremiah Godwin for the sum of six hundred dollars; and one in favor of the said Philip C. Johnson for the sum of thirty eight dollars and fifty cents - which will be in full for their accounts aforesaid - to be charged to the appropriation for the payment thereof by the Act of March 23, 1839,
