Note. There is due from the Clerk of Court in Lincoln to the County Treasurer the sum of 29.50 for costs, awarded against town of Lisbon at the Sep. Term of C. C. Pleas 1835 also due from the Sheriff of S. County to S. County Treasurer of 55.26 on Warrant vs. Inhab. of Whitefield for costs awarded v. S. town Sep. Term. S. J. Court 1835. — But these sums, the County Treasurer, when they are collected by him, will then owe to the State. A minute of these two unsettled items has been made. They will probably be included in the next account.
