

The Hon. the Governor and Council

Gentlemen

In order to meet the expenses incurred and to be incurred, for pay and subsistence of the Militia in actual service, previous to the next session of the Council, it will probably require funds to the amount of one hundred ^{and fifty} thousand dollars - I would therefore respectfully suggest the expediency of having warrants to that amount now drawn, in sums of ten thousand dollars, to be used as occasion may require

Warrants for the following purposes are also now required, ~~vide~~ under the act of March 23. 1839, entitled "An act to provide in part for the expenditures of Government", viz:
