

To the Hon. Governor, & the Hon. Council of the
State of Maine -

The undersigned, would respectfully represent, that they are
members of the company of Infantry belonging to the Third
Regiment, First Brigade, and eighth Division, in the town
of Embden in the County of Somerset, commanded by Capt.
Samuel A. Campbell, that said company is so much reduced
in numbers, that little or no good can be derived from
our military discipline, that the limitations of our com-
pany are such that there is no prospect that for many
years the settlers in the limits of the same will be such
as to afford a sufficiently number of soldiers, to give any
efficiency to the company, or to render it other than a
burden to ^{the} officers who may command it - exclusive of
conditional and other recruits, there are only eight privates
on the Roll, or who can be relied on as ready to meet
the requisitions of the law - We would therefore request
that said company be disbanded, and the members thereof
be attached to such other company or companies as you
in your wisdom shall think proper, and advisable -
