In Council March 27, 1838

The Standing Committee on warrants Report: That in pursuance of certain Resolves of the Legislature, passed March 1838, the Governor be advised to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of State, in favor of said Treasurer, for the sum of two hundred six dollars and thirty cents, to be paid out agreeably to the provisions of the Resolve aforesaid as follows, viz: to Solomon Nash Jr. two dollars and eighty cents - to Charles Jones, thirteen dollars - Niel Kelley, and four others, forty six dollars and twenty cents - to Samuel Hasey and Merrill Clough, eight dollars each - to Backus Kent, seven dollars and forty cents - to Elisha Hewett, seven dollars and twenty cents - to Rufus Sewall and two others, thirty four dollars and sixty five cents - to Gideon Richards, thirty nine dollars and five cents - being the several sums allowed them for travel and attendance as witnesses, during the last session of the Legislature - S. Nathaniel Hansecom fifteen dollars, and to Ingraham Duncan twenty five dollars, being the amount allowed them for expenses for medical aid while attending as members of the Legislature; for the faithful application of which said Treasurer is to be accountable; to be charged to the appropriation made for the payment of the Senate and House of Representatives per Act of March 23.<sup>d</sup> 1838.
