The Committee of the whole Council, to which was referred the petition of J. B. Sawntow and others, Inhabitants of the town of Windsor, praying for the pardon of James Dunlap, have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to

Report;

That at a term of the Court of Common Pleas, begun and holden at Augusta, within and for the County of Kennebec, on the first Tuesday of April A.D. 1838, the said James Dunlap was convicted of unlawfully and riotously disturbing the public peace, and thereupon was sentenced by said Court to forty five days confinement in the County gaol.

Having investigated the facts in this case, and having ascertained that said Dunlap is a youth of eighteen years of age, who had previously sustained a good moral character, the committee are of opinion that the prayer of the petitioners ought to be granted. - They therefore recommend that the Governor be advised to grant said Dunlap a full and free pardon of the crime aforesaid.
