Ordinance That Tuesday the 30<sup>th</sup> day of January instant at 12 O'clock at noon be assigned for the Senate & House of Representatives to proceed to the choice of a Senator to represent this State in the Senate of the United States.

The House of Representatives shall proceed first on their part & send up the name of the person chosen for concurrence, & if the Senate non concur they shall then send down for concurrence the name of such person as shall be by them chosen & so vice versa until a choice shall be effected; & if no choice shall be effected on the day assigned aforesaid the two Houses shall have a right to assign a further time from day to day till a choice shall be effected. Report Read & accepted & Order passed. Sent down for concurrence came up concurred.
