Committee of both Houses, appointed to consider the expediency of laying a tax on the Capital Stock of Insurance Companies, Reported that it would be inexpedient, at the present time to make any provision by law for taxing the same.

Read & accepted. Sent down for concurrence.
Same up concurred.

Bills intitled "An Act for the support & regulation of Mills." "An Act respecting mortgages & the right in equity of redemption." "An Act to set off part of the town of Hartland & annex the same to the town of Athol." "An Act to incorporate the Bath Steam Mill Company" "An Act for the partition of Lands or other real estate" "An Act to set off part of the town of Livermore in the County of Oxford & annex it to the town of Wayne in the County of Kennebec," severally passed to be enacted.
