That the Secretary of State be instructed to change the official tabulation of the votes cast in the towns of Litchfield, Rumorh and Wadsworth, County of Hancock for the office of Representative to the Legislature, Republican Party, at the Primary Election of June 21, 1904 as follows:

Robert W. Marshall received 470 votes instead of 468 as shown by the official tabulation.

and

Loretta S. Novak received 488 votes instead of 486 as shown by the official tabulation.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On July 2, 1904 an inspection of the ballots cast in the towns of Litchfield, Rumorh and Wadsworth, at the Republican Primary Election of June 21, 1904, was conducted by Robert W. Marshall and Loretta S. Novak, candidates for the office of Representative to the Legislature, at said Primary Election. After inspection an agreement, which is attached hereto, was signed by Robert W. Marshall and Loretta S. Novak in accordance with the provisions of Section 22 of Chapter 4 of the Revised Statutes agreeing that the returns for said towns of Litchfield, Rumorh and Wadsworth for Representative to the Legislature, should be 470 for Robert W. Marshall instead of 468 and 488 for Loretta S. Novak instead of 486.

The petition of Norman Dyer, candidate for Sheriff, Hancock County in the June primary was considered. The petitioner, through his Attorney, Arthur Blaisdell, Esq., Ellsworth, agreed that the vote as reported by the election officials of the various municipalities in Hancock County with reference to the office of Sheriff was correct.

He asked the Council, however, to declare void all the votes cast in Ward 2 of the City of Ellsworth at the Primary Election of June 21 on the ground that the election officials through error and without fraudulent intent opened the polls fifteen minutes earlier than called for in the warrant, that after nine people had voted they closed the polls, unlocked and opened the ballot box, removed the ballots which were thereafter kept separate and invited the nine voters to return when the polls were legally opened to vote the second time.

Herritt P. Fitch of Ellsworth, represented by Charles Hurley, Esq., of Ellsworth contended that any violation of law that occurred in Ward 2 in Ellsworth was a violation of a directory provision and in the absence of the allegation of fraud the vote should stand.

The Council thereupon voted to deny the petition and the number of votes cast in said ward for the respective parties as shown by the official returns was confirmed.

The second petition of Charles Murray of Baileyville was heard. The petitioner was represented by James Archibald, Esq. of Houlton. His opponent for the Republican nomination for the House of Representatives, Clyde Brown of Baileyville was represented by Sanford Fogg, Esq. of Augusta. The parties agreed that if the vote for each cast in the Town of Danforth as determined at the inspection on July 9 should be allowed to stand, Clyde Brown would be the winner.

If, however, the vote in the Town of Danforth was rejected by the Governor and Council, Charles Murray would be the winner. The petitioner did not allege fraud on the part of the election officers but contended that because the official returns showed 29 votes cast for Mr. Brown whereas an inspection of the ballots cast disclosed that actually 46 votes were received by him coupled with the fact admitted by the clerk of the Town of Danforth that no enrollment list was used at the primary election of June 21, the Council should reject as invalid all ballots cast for this office in the town.

The Attorney General advised the Council that the violation alleged appeared to be the violation of a directory provision of law and that the ballots should be counted whereupon the petitioner, through his attorney withdrew his petition and requested the Governor and Council to correct the vote in the Town of Danforth in accordance with the inspection.

It was therefore voted that Clyde Brown of Baileyville received 45 votes in the Town of Danforth and that Charles Murray of Baileyville received 28 votes in said town at the primary election of June 21.

The Secretary of State was instructed to change the records as follows: Clyde Brown 369 votes, Charles Murray, 342.

The recount petition of Norman Currier of Caribou was heard. The petitioner was represented by Richard Sanford, Esq. of Augusta. His opponent, Ezra Briggs, was represented by Hollis Molean, Esq. of Augusta.

Both parties had agreed that Briggs had received 476 and Currier had received 477 votes with 20 ballots in dispute. Attorney Molean, stating that he did not represent Mr. Briggs at the time the agreement was signed, requested the right to have the ballots recounted. Attorney Sanborn objected and on motion of Councilor Batchelder it was voted that both parties were bound by the agreement entered into on July 15.

Argument was held with reference to the validity of the disputed ballots following which the Governor and Council proceeded to examine same. They rejected four as being invalid, counted eight for Currier and eight for Briggs, making the final result Currier 485 as shown on the original return and Briggs 484 instead of 489 as shown by the official tabulation. The Secretary of State was instructed to correct the records in accordance with this finding.

This is to follow the executive session:

The Secretary of State reports that a careful examination of the Democratic votes cast for the office of representative to the Legislature showed that Rita Michaud of Madawaska and Camille Cannon of Madawaska received 22 votes each.
