Attended town schools and graduated from Patten Academy in 1922.

Taught one year in rural school near home.

Attended University of Maine, graduating in 1927 with

honors. Active in sports, writing, and art lines. Member

of Delta Zeta, Contributors' Club, Y.W.C.A. cabinet,

Women's Athletic Board, "Campus" reporter and women's

sports editor, Outing Club, Phi Beta Kappa, Phi Kappa

Phi, All-Maine Women, associate editor of "Maine-Spring",

Class Poet, winner of 1st and 3rd prizes in Intercollegiate

Poetry Contests.

Taught history and English three years at Mattanawcook

Academy in Lincoln. Started correspondence course in art.

Attended summer school at Orono in 1930, and as graduate

fellow in English and assistant matron at Balentine

remained the following year, receiving an M.A. in English

June, 1931.

Taught English and American History three years at Woodland

High School, Woodland, Maine.

Feb., 1934, thesis, "The Novels of William Hurrell Mallock",
published by University of Maine.

Now at home on father's farm in Patten, enjoying various

hobbies--camping, winter sports, art, and quilt-making.

Various poems have appeared in the "Maine-Spring", "Portland

Press-Herald", and "Sun-Up", besides the recent "Maine

and Vermont Poets."
