he was directed by the officer about the  
plan he was to have he is one of  
the selectmen of this Town and Elites  
Capt in the Militia he seems to be  
a man that is beloved by all and willing  
to return to his post if the law requires  
it

with me is can he be held  
before he is mustered in to the service
