***Combination hunting and fishing license for Maine residents in U.S. armed forces, stationed outside Maine; valid for all leaves during year of issue. Sold by town clerks in town of residence.

It is the applicant's responsibility to submit proof of residency.

†This is the only nonresident license of any kind that is exchangeable; for \$5.50, it may be exchanged for a season license.

(DUPLICATE LICENSES)

All **nonresident** duplicates of licenses lost, etc., must be obtained from the Department office in Augusta.

All **resident** duplicate licenses must be obtained from the clerk who issued the original licenses.

(EXPIRATION DATE)

All licenses expire at midnight of December 31 of the year of issue.

FISHING LICENSES

No resident of the state over 16 years of age and no nonresident over the age of 12 years can lawfully fish through the ice in any inland waters of the state, or transport any fish taken therefrom, without a fishing license.

The 3-day license is for 3 consecutive days only. This license cannot be exchanged for any nonresident license, but may be exchanged by a resident for season fishing license only (not a hunting or combination), on payment of clerk's fee.

Resident must procure license in municipality of residence. Exception, 3-day license.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Read carefully the county and group headings for exceptions to General Provisions.

Sec. 2651. Ice fishing regulated. All inland waters of the state are closed to ice fishing except those which have been opened to fishing through the ice by rule and regulation of the commissioner. A person legally licensed may fish through the ice in the daytime with not more than 5 lines, set or otherwise, which shall be under the immediate supervision of such person, in any waters which have been opened to ice fishing by the commissioner.

It shall be lawful to fish in the nighttime by using not more than 5 lines set or otherwise for cusk* in the waters which have been opened to ice fishing by the commissioner. The commissioner may open other waters for fishing for cusk in the nighttime. Lines set for cusk in the nighttime must be visited at least once in every hour by the person setting the same.

Except as set forth in this section, it shall be unlawful to ice fish from 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise of the following morning.

Unless otherwise specified, the use or possession of live fish as bait, the legal lengths, and daily limits which have been established for open water fishing in each county shall apply to all waters open to ice fishing in those counties.

Heads and tails, or either, may not be detached from salmon, trout, togue or black bass, unless the fish are being prepared for cooking, unless the dressed length is equal to or greater than the legal length.

No person shall take, kill, catch or have in possession more than 4 quarts of smelts in any one day.

The term, **GENERAL LAW**, as applied to ice fishing, means that waters opened under the **GENERAL LAW** are open to the taking of pickerel, white perch, hornpout, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs, and smelts from the time ice forms in the fall until March 31, and for all game fish in February and March. Fishing is restricted to the hours between 1/2 hour before sunrise and 1/2 hour after sunset except that cusk may be taken in the nighttime in those waters designated as open to night fishing for cusk.

Unless otherwise prohibited by rule and regulation, it shall be lawful to take black bass through the ice during the same period it is lawful to take salmon and trout.

Sec. 2752. Certain implements and devices. It shall be unlawful to angle or fish other than by the use of the single-baited hook and line, artificial flies, artificial lures, and spinners.

DAILY BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS—GENERAL

Refer to County Headings for Special Regulations.

A person shall not have in his possession at any time more fish than he may lawfully take in one day.

Whenever any waters have a special bag limit, no person shall have in possession more than 1 day's bag limit taken from those waters.

In all cases wherein the daily bag limit differs from the tables as listed, the limit of fish which may be legally taken by any one person in any one day is stated herein either in numbers of fish or pounds under county or group headings.

Where county lines divide a body of water, the more liberal county regulations shall apply.

Sec. 2251. Lumber camps shall not serve salmon, trout, togue, bass or pickereel. No owner, keeper or employee thereof or any other person shall have in

possession any salmon, trout, togue, black bass, white perch or pickerel from the inland waters of the state for the purpose of serving or consuming the same in any camp, house or other building used partly or wholly in lumbering operations, log driving, or construction of any kind. It shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section on the part of any keeper or owner of such camp used in lumbering or construction operations to have in his possession in such camp any fish described in this section. The provisions of this section shall not apply to pickerel in Washington County.

SEC. 1954. BOUNDARY WATERS WITH NEW HAMPSHIRE.

Live Bait for Fishing: It shall be unlawful to take, sell, use, or have in possession either dead or alive, for use as bait for fishing in the above-named waters, any pickerel, goldfish, yellow perch, white perch, bass, sun-fish, crappie, horned pout, carp or any spiny-finned fish.

Ice Fishing Season: Ice fishing season for all species except lake trout, brook trout, and salmon — ice-in to March 31. Lake trout and brook trout February 1 to March 31. No ice fishing for salmon. Only 5 lines permitted while ice fishing.

Limits: Brook trout (includes rainbows and browns), and lake trout: limit, 8 fish or 7½ pounds in aggregate. Brook trout length limit, 6 inches. Lake trout length limit, 14 inches. Bass: 5 fish, no length limit, no weight limit. Pickerel: 10 fish, no length limit, no weight limit. Bullhead (horned pout): no length limit, no weight limit, no creel limit. White perch and yellow perch: no length limit, no weight limit, no creel limit.

*** Exceptions — Umbagog Lake**

Brook trout — 5 fish or 7½ pounds per day in aggregate; length limit, 6 inches.

Ice fishing season for all fish except salmon, lake trout and trout from ice-in to March 31st. Daily pickerel limit, ice fishing season, 5 fish.

Sec. 2751. Sale of certain fish prohibited; penalty. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or buy directly or indirectly any landlocked salmon, trout,

togue, black bass, white perch, or pickerel except that pickerel may be sold in Washington County. A violation of this section shall be subject to the penalties provided in section 3060, and costs, for each offense, and in addition thereto, \$1 for each fish sold or purchased.

SEC. 2554-A. BOUNDARY WATERS BETWEEN MAINE AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Waters affected by this section are as follows: In the County of Aroostook: Glazier Lake, North Lake, The Thoroughfare between North and East Grand Lake, and East Grand Lake; in the County of Washington, East Grand Lake, Mud Lake, Spednik Lake, and Grand Falls flowage.

Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the open season for ice fishing on these waters for all species except salmon, trout, togue and bass, shall be from January 1st to March 31st of each year. All other waters on the boundary between the State of Maine and Province of New Brunswick shall be closed to ice fishing.

Sec. 2653. Ice fishing shacks to be removed. No owner of any shack or temporary structure used for ice fishing purposes shall leave or allow the same to remain on the ice of any inland waters three days after the waters on which such shack or temporary structure is located closes to ice fishing. When said structure is on the ice of any inland waters, the owner's name and address shall be painted on the outside of said shack in 2-inch letters. Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$300 and costs or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.

Sec. 2558. Live bait for fishing. It shall be unlawful to take, sell, use or have in possession, either dead or alive, for use as bait for fishing in the inland waters of this state any pickerel, goldfish, yellow perch, white perch, bass, sunfish, crappie, hornpout, carp or any spiny-finned fish.

It shall be unlawful to import into this state any live fish, including smelts, which are commonly used for bait fishing in inland waters.

Sec. 2756. Advance baiting. Whoever deposits any meat, bones, dead fish, or parts of the same, or other food for fish in any of the inland waters of the state for the purpose of luring fish, known as "advance baiting," shall be subject to the penalties provided in section 3060, and costs of prosecution, for each offense.

Special Regulations

Waters listed here as "Open per Group A" are NOT open to fishing for trout, salmon, bass, or togue in February and March unless listed ALSO as "Open per Group B" or otherwise so designated.

Nezinscot River, Turner. Open to ice fishing from the time ice forms in the fall until March 31 under the general laws, from the Central Maine Power Company transmission line crossing said river approximately 500 yards below the junction with Martin Stream to the dam in Turner Village.

Thompson Lake, Poland (also Cumberland and Oxford counties): Open for all fish, except salmon and smelts, during February and March. Minimum length on togue, 14 inches. General law bag limit.

Waters listed here as "Open per Group A" are NOT open to fishing for trout, salmon, bass, or togue in February and March unless listed ALSO as "Open per Group B" or otherwise so designated.

Cross Lake, T.16,R.5, T.17,R5: Open to ice fishing at night from sunset to sunrise for cusk from ice-in until March 31. Use or possession of live fish as bait is prohibited. Smelts may be taken by hook and line only, from ice-in to March 31.

Drew Lake (also called Meduxnekeag Lake), Oakfield, New Limerick, and Linneus: Open per Group A and Group B.

Mattawamkeag Lake, Upper and Lower, Island Falls and T.4,R.3, W.E.L.S.: Open per Group A and also for trout and salmon from February 1 to March 31.

Pleasant Lake, Island Falls and T.4, R.3. Open per Group A and Group B. Minimum length of salmon, 14 inches. Also open to ice fishing for smelts according to regulations for the group below Group C.

Wheelock Lake, St. John Plt.: Open per Group B. Daily limit 5 trout. Use or possession of live fish as bait prohibited.

Special Regulations

Waters listed here as "Open per Group A" are NOT open to fishing for trout, salmon, bass, or togue in February and March unless listed ALSO as "Open per Group B" or otherwise so designated.

Coffee Pond, Casco. Open to taking of smelts by hook and line only, from ice-in to March 31 in that portion of the pond more than 100 yards from any shoreline. Closed to all ice fishing is that area within 100 yards of the shoreline.

Moose Pond, Bridgton and Denmark. Counties of Cumberland and Oxford: Open per Group A and Group B, except that part of the pond from Route 302 south to Walkers Bridge which shall be open per Group B only.

Panther Pond, Raymond. Open per Group A except closed to the taking of salmon and trout during the entire ice fishing season.

Peabody Pond, Naples, Sebago and Bridgton. Open per Group A for all fish except trout and salmon. Closed to the taking of smelts except by hook and line.

Pleasant Lake, Casco and Otisfield. Open per Group A except that smelts may not be taken by any method.

Royal River. Open per Group A in No. Yarmouth and Yarmouth from Dunn's Depot Bridge to Weston Dam.

Sabbathday Lake, New Gloucester. Open per Group A. Daily bag limit of five trout during February and March.

Sebago Lake, Windham, Standish, Sebago, Naples, Casco and Raymond. Open per Group A for all fish EXCEPT salmon, trout, and togue.

Thompson Lake, Casco, Otisfield. See special regulation under Androscoggin County.

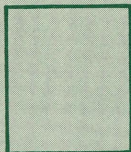
