Read carefully the county and group headings for exceptions to General Provisions.

Ice fishing regulated. All inland waters of the state are closed to ice fishing except those which have been opened to fishing through the ice by rule and regulation of the commissioner. A person legally licensed may fish through the ice in any inland water not more than 5 lines, set or otherwise, which shall be under the immediate supervision of such person, in any waters which have been opened to ice fishing by the commissioner. Fishing is restricted to the hours between 9:00 hour before sunrise and 9:00 hour after sunset except that cusk may be taken in the nighttime in waters designated as open to ice fishing, and smelts may be taken at night from those waters designated by rule and regulation as being open to smelt fishing at night.

It shall be lawful to fish in the nighttime by using not more than 5 lines set or otherwise for cusk in the waters which have been opened to ice fishing by the commissioner. Lines set for cusk in the nighttime must be visited at least once in every hour by the person atting the same.

Unless otherwise specified, the use or possession of live fish as bait, the legal lengths, and daily limits which have been established for open waters fishing in each county shall apply to all waters open to ice fishing in those counties.

Head and tails, or either, may not be detached from salmon, trout, togue or black bass, unless the fish are being prepared for cooking, unless the dressed length is equal to or greater than the legal length.

No person shall take, kill, catch or have in possession more than 2 quarts of smelts in any one day.

Unless otherwise provided by rule and regulation, it shall be lawful to take black bass through the ice during the same period it is lawful to take salmon and trout.

All ponds of 10 acres or less formed on brooks, streams, or rivers shall be governed by the same law or rules and regulations for fishing that apply to the stream on which they are situated, whether the pond is natural or artificial. This does not apply to private ponds as defined in the fish and wildlife laws.

Ice fishing shacks shall be removed. No owner of any shack or temporary structure used for ice fishing purposes shall leave or allow the same to remain on the ice of any inland waters three days after the waters on which such shack or temporary structure is located closes to ice fishing. When said structure is on the ice of any inland waters, the owner's name and address shall be painted on the outside of said shack in 2-inch letters. Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$300 and costs or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.

Sale of certain fish prohibited: penalty. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or buy directly or indirectly any landlocked salmon, trout, togue, black bass, white perch, or pickerel except that pickerel may be sold in Washington County. A violation of this section shall be subject to the penalties as defined in the fish and wildlife laws and costs for each offense, and in addition thereof, \$1 for each fish sold or purchased.

Use of helicopter for transporting fishermen. No person shall use a helicopter for the purpose of transporting a sports fisherman or a sport fish from or from any pond under 10 acres in size or any beaver flowage.

Live bait for fishing. It shall be unlawful to take, sell, use or have in possession either dead or alive, for use as bait for fishing in the inland waters of this state any cunner, goldfish, yellow perch, white perch, bass, sunfish, crappie, hornpout, carp or any spiny-finned fish.

It shall be unlawful to import into this state any live fish, including minnows, which are commonly used for bait fishing in inland waters.

Live bait dealers' licenses. The commissioner is authorized to issue two different licenses allowing the licensee to deal in live bait.

1. Regular live bait dealer's license — the holder of this license, issued at a fee of \$15 per calendar year, may use a dip net to take smelts, minnows, and other unpoisoned fish commonly used for bait, through the ice on waters designated as open to ice fishing, designated by the commissioner's regulations restricted to hook and line fishing only for smelts, (b) boundary waters between Maine and New Hampshire, and between Maine and New Brunswick, and (c) in the case of night dipping, waters not specified as open to fishing for smelts at night.

The daily limit of smelts under this license is two quarts. More than this quantity may be possessed, provided the taking was legal.

2. Live smelt bait dealer's license — the holder of this license, issued at a fee of \$25 per calendar year, may take at any time with a dip net, drop net, or hook and line, from inland waters designated by the commissioner's regulations for resale, a list of waters closed to the taking of smelts with this license is available from the Fish and Wildlife Department upon request. The daily limit of smelts under this license is eight quarts. More than this quantity may be possessed, provided the taking was legal.

NOTE being listed has different meanings in different counties. In Androscoggin County, lakes and ponds which are not listed are closed until January 1. They are open to ice fishing for all kinds of fish during January, February and March.

ANDROSCOGGIN COUNTY SPECIAL REGULATIONS

AN-1: Nezincost River — Open to ice fishing from the time ice forms in the fall until March 31 under the general laws, from the Central Maine Power Company transmission line, crossing said river, approximately 500 yards below the junction with Main Street to the dam in Turner Village.

AN-2: Thompson Lake — Open during the month of February only, except that night fishing for cusk is permitted during January, February, and March. No ice fishing for salmon or smelts. Daily limit on togue: two fish.

AN-3 Little Androscoggin River — Open per Class A is that section of the river from the Oxford/Mechanic Falls town line to its confluence with the Androscoggin River in Auburn (see also Oxford County).

COMPLAINTS

Lakes and Ponds

Daily bag and possession limit of salmon, trout, and togue — five fish, not to include more than two salmon, two togue, three brown trout, three rainbow trout. All five may be brook trout, except in CUMBERLAND and YORK Counties, where no more than three may be brook trout.

Brooks, Streams and Rivers (WHERE OPEN)

In CUMBERLAND, YORK, OXFORD and ANDROSCOGGIN Counties — daily bag and possession limit on salmon, trout, togue — five fish, not to include more than two salmon, two togue, three brown trout, or three rainbow trout. All five may be brook trout.

In all other counties (except WASHINGTON — see county heading) — daily bag and possession limit on salmon, trout, and togue — 10 fish, not to include more than two salmon, two togue, three brown trout, or three rainbow trout. All 10 may be brook trout.

NOTE: In all cases above, total weight of the fish taken must not exceed 7 1/2 pounds, unless the weight of the last fish caught brings the total to more than 7 1/2 pounds.

AROOSTOOK COUNTY

NOTE being listed has different meanings in different counties. In Aroostook County, waters which are not listed are closed to ice fishing.

AK-1: Pleasant Lake — Open to ice fishing for smelts, from the time the ice forms in the fall until March 31; with night fishing permitted, 3 hooks per line permitted, hooks to be not less than 4 inches apart.

AK-2: Aroostook River — Daily bag and possession limit on trout: two fish; ice fishing restricted to 2 lines per person.

AK-3: Eagle, Long, Pleasant, Portage, St. Froid, Big Machias, Squa Pan, Rowe lakes — Open per Class B. Smelts may be taken at night.

AK-4: Spaulding Lake — Smelts, perch and pickerel may be taken at night.

AK-5: Cross, Square, Portland lakes — Open per Class B. Smelts may be taken in the nighttime. Smelts may be taken by hook and line only.

CUMBERLAND COUNTY SPECIAL REGULATIONS

CD-1: Saco River — From New Hampshire border to tidewater: open per Class B. (Also in Oxford County.)

CD-2: Sebago Lake — Open per Class B. Two togue daily limit. Trout and salmon may not be taken by ice fishing. Smelts may be taken only by hook and line. Closed to ice fishing for all species from the Lake within 3,000 feet of a red post on the shore marking a point of the 2 Portland Water District intakes. Also closed is the area within 100 feet of the intake.

CD-3: Peabody Pond, Naples and Sebago — open per Group B except that trout and salmon may not be taken by ice fishing. Smelts may be taken by hook and line only. S-22

Lakes and Ponds

Brooks, Streams and Rivers (WHERE OPEN)

In CUMBERLAND, YORK, OXFORD and ANDROSCOGGIN Counties — daily bag and possession limit on salmon, trout, togue — five fish, not to include more than two salmon, two togue, three brown trout, or three rainbow trout. All five may be brook trout.

In all other counties (except WASHINGTON — see county heading) — daily bag and possession limit on salmon, trout, and togue — 10 fish, not to include more than two salmon, two togue, three brown trout, or three rainbow trout. All 10 may be brook trout.

NOTE: In all cases above, total weight of the fish taken must not exceed 7 1/2 pounds, unless the weight of the last fish caught brings the total to more than 7 1/2 pounds.

IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE FISH, YOU MAY TAKE OR HAVE IN YOUR POSSESSION EACH YEAR:

BLACK BASS — Five fish, not to exceed a combined weight of 7 1/2 pounds, unless the weight of the last fish caught brings the total to more than 7 1/2 pounds; minimum length limit 10 inches; AND
SMELTS — Eight fish, no size or weight limit; AND
SMELTS — Two quarts, no size or weight limit; AND
ALL OTHER SPECIES (except Atlantic sea run salmon) — no limits.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

The following table contains regulations that may apply to waters in any county. Special regulations that occur in one county only will be found at the end of the listings of waters in that county.

S-1: Closed to the taking of smelts.

S-2: Smelts may be taken only by hook and line.

S-3: Night fishing for smelts permitted: 3 hooks per line permitted, hooks to be not less than 4 inches apart.

S-4: Use or possession or taking of live fish for use as bait is prohibited.

S-5: Smelts may be taken at night.

S-6: Minimum length limit on salmon: 12 inches.

S-7: Minimum length limit on togue: 12 inches.

S-8: Minimum length limit on brown trout: 14 inches.

S-9: Minimum length limit on Sunapee trout: 12 inches.

S-10: Open to night fishing for smelts, yellow perch, and chubs.

S-11: Boundary waters with New Brunswick: see Panel 9.

S-12: Restricted to two lines per person.

S-13: Boundary waters with New Hampshire: see Panel 18.

S-14: Open per Class B for all fish except salmon, trout and togue.

S-15: Trout and salmon may not be taken by ice fishing.

S-16: Open per Class A for all fish except salmon, togue, and trout.

S-17: Daily bag and possession limit: two fish.

S-18: Two fish daily bag limit in the aggregate of salmon and togue.

S-19: Daily bag and possession limit: two fish.

S-20: Daily bag and possession limit: two fish in the aggregate of salmon, trout, and togue.

S-21: No bag limit on pickerel.

S-22: No size or bag limit on bass and pickerel.

S-23: No size or bag limit on smallmouth bass.

S-24: No size or bag limit on bass.

S-25: Daily limit on togue: two fish.

S-26: Minimum length limit on togue: 20 inches.

S-27: Daily limit on salmon: one fish.

S-28: Daily limit on white perch: 25 fish.

S-29: Trout may not be taken by ice fishing.

S-30: Daily limit on salmon: five fish.

S-31: Daily limit on togue: one fish.

S-32: Daily bag and possession limit: five fish in the aggregate of trout and togue — no more than one may be a togue.

FISHING LICENSES

No resident of the state 16 or older and no nonresident 12 or older can lawfully fish through the ice in any inland waters of the state, or transport any fish taken therefrom, without a license.

The 3-day license is for 3 consecutive days only. This license cannot be exchanged for any nonresident license, but may be exchanged by a resident for season fishing license only (not a hunting or combination), on payment of clerk's fee.

Resident must procure license in municipality of residence. Exception: 3-day license.

HK-1: Burnt and Floods ponds — No person shall ice fish at said Floods Pond, no person shall engage in or attempt to engage in ice fishing on said Burnt Pond; no person shall engage in or attempt to engage in any recreational activity whatsoever within the area situated between Floods Pond and Burnt Pond. No person shall wear linen or other articles of personal apparel in the waters of either Floods Pond or Burnt Pond. Any person violating this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 for each such offense.

HK-2: Lower Patten Pond — Minimum length on brown trout: 16 inches.

HK-3: Eagle Lake, Bar Harbor — Open per Class B. Daily bag and possession limit on togue: 5 fish; and on salmon, trout, and togue: more than 2 salmon, 2 trout, or 2 togue. Minimum length limit on brook trout: 12 inches during ice fishing season. Maximum length on salmon, 16 inches. Only live or dead fish or artificial lures may be used as bait.
