

I Thomas Rumrill of Roxbury in the County of Norfolk and
Commonwealth of Massachusetts on oath do say -

That I on the 3^d day of September 1777 enlisted as a piper
in the Regiment of Infantry, in the Continental service, command-
ed by Col. Henry Jackson. and in the company commanded
by Capt. John Hastings. That the place of my residence at
the time of my enlistment was Dorchester, and not Roxbury
as mentioned in the rolls at the Land office, and that
my residence at the present time, and ever since my dis-
charge, on the 3^d day September 1780, is, and has been at
Roxbury aforesaid. That I served in said Regiment
and company the full term of three years, and at the expira-
tion of that term, I was honorably discharged. - But that
through some accident I have lost the certificate of my
discharge - and that I have no evidence of my said
discharge but what is found on the rolls at the Land office

Know all Men by these presents,
That I Thomas Rumrill of Roxbury,
in the County of Norfolk, and Common-
wealth of Massachusetts, formerly a soldier
in the fourteenth Massachusetts regiment
commanded by Colonel Henry Jackson

In consideration of the sum of
Fifty - - - - - dollars to
me in hand paid by Abner Coburn
and Isaac Farrar both of Bloomfield State
of Maine I do hereby remise, release, and
assign unto the said Abner Coburn &
Isaac Farrar - all my right, title
and interest, in and unto two hundred
acres of land to which I am entitled
by virtue of a grant made to the soldiers
of the revolutionary war, pursuant to
resolves of the Legislature of said Com-
monwealth passed the 27 day of March last,
and I do hereby request the said Agent
of said Commonwealth to execute a deed
accordingly Dated at Boston this thirteenth
day of May 1833 -
