Know all Men by these Presents, THAT

I whose name is undersigned and seal hereunto affixed
appointed an AGENT by the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to make
and execute conveyances, agreeably to resolves of said Court passed the seventeenth
day of June eighteen hundred and twenty — and pursuant to
resolves of said Court passed the fourth day of March eighteen
hundred and twenty eight, Eighteenth day of
February eighteen hundred and twenty nine and
eighteenth day of February eighteen hundred and
thirty one —

do give, grant, convey and confirm, and by these presents, in behalf of said Commonwealth,
have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto Levi Smith, Melinda French
and Triphene Hodges, the only children and heirs at law
of Robert Smith, deceased, formerly a private in the
first Massachusetts regiment Commanded by
Col. Putnam —

who enlisted as a Soldier into the American Army to serve during the revolutionary War
with Great Britain, and who was returned as a part of the Massachusetts quota of said
Army, and who did actually serve in said Army the full term of three years, and was hon-
orably discharged, and to his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, and interest of said
Commonwealth, in and unto a lot of land numbered Sixty or the southerly
part thereof — — — situate and lying in a township, in the County
of Penobscot — in the State of Maine, numbered two in the
seventh range of townships west of the east line
of the State — — —

said lot contains two hundred acres, bounded on the East by lot number
Eighty eight, there measuring one hundred thirty rods
on the south by lot number fifty nine on the west by
lot number seventy two there measuring one hundred
and sixty rods, and on the north two hundred rods by an
imaginary line cutting off the northerly part of said lot —
according to a plan of the survey of said township made by Joseph P. Holsey —
in the autumn of the year — eighteen hundred and twenty
nine — and will more fully appear on reference being had to said plan now on file in
the Land Office.

To Have and to Hold the aforegranted premises to the said Levi Smith,
Melinda French & Triphene Hodges ^{their} heirs and assigns, to their use
and behoof forever. IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my
seal this ninth - day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen
hundred and thirty three

heirs by virtue of a resolve of the Legislature of
this State passed Feb'y. 18th A.D. 1829 granting
Land to revolutionary Soldiers. Melinda French
