Know all Men by these Presents, THAT

whose name is undersigned & seal hereunto affixed

appointed an AGENT by the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to make and execute conveyances, agreeably to resolves of said Court passed *the 17th day*

of June 1820 — — — — —

and pursuant to

resolves of said Court passed *the fourth day of March 1828,*

18th day of February 1829, and 18th day of February 1831 — — — — —

do give, grant, convey and confirm, and by these presents, in behalf of said Commonwealth, have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto *the heirs of Asa Virgil*

deceased, formerly a Corporal in the fourth Massachusetts Regiment Commanded by Colonel Shepard — — — — —

who enlisted as a Soldier into the American Army to serve during the revolutionary War with Great Britain, and who was returned as a part of the Massachusetts quota of said Army, and who did actually serve in said Army the full term of three years, and was honorably discharged, and to his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, and interest of said Commonwealth, in and unto a lot of land numbered *Sixty two*

situate and lying in a township, in the County

of *Pendecost* in the State of Maine, numbered *two* in the *seventh range of townships west of the east line of said State* — — — — —

said lot contains two hundred acres, bounded *on the north by lot number Sixty three, on the east by lot number fifty, on the south by lot number sixty one, and on the west by lot number seventy four*

according to a plan of the survey of said township made by *Joseph L. Holsey* in the *Autumn of the year* *eighteen hundred and twenty nine* and will more fully appear on reference being had to said plan now on file in the Land Office.

To Have and to Hold the aforegranted premises to the *heirs of said Asa Virgil* *their* heirs and assigns, to their use and behoof forever. IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal this *first* day of *February* in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and *thirty three*

I Melinda Doty Daughter
and Heir at law to Asa Virgil Deceased being duly
sworn do testify & declare that according to the
best of my knowledge and belief Asa Virgil
aforesaid about or in the year 1777 enlisted into
the Army of the American Revolution in the
service of the State of Massachusetts for the
term of "During the War" and that He served in
the 4th Regiment of Infantry commanded by Colonel

Shepherd - and was honorably discharged at the
close of the war I further declare that the afore-
said Asa Virgil was an invalid pensioner in con-
sequence of a wound received from a musket
ball in his Country's service and that He drew
a pension under the acts of Congress passed in 1818
and 1820 until the close of His life

I further declare that I have not received a Title
to the Quantity of land promised to Asa Virgil
aforesaid on the part of the State of Massachusetts
nor do I believe that He ever received it or
any commutation therefor

Therefore I know all men by
presents that I Melinda Doty aforesaid do hereby
constitute and appoint Lewis Wakeley of the
City of Albany my true and lawful Attorney
for me and in my name to select such Lot
or Lots of Land (from the tract appropriated by
the State of Massachusetts) for the settlement of
Revolutionary Bounty land claims) as to my
said attorney shall seem fit and proper
and to receive in my name from the Agent
of Massachusetts a title or deed therefor

this 24th day of December 1832
