Know all Men by these Presents, THAT

Whose name is undersigned & seal hereunto affixed appointed an AGENT by the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to make and execute conveyances, agreeably to a resolve of said Court passed the seventeenth day of June eighteen hundred and twenty and pursuant to resolves of said Court passed the fifth day of March and nineteenth day of June eighteen hundred and one, nineteenth day of February eighteen hundred and thirteen, fourth day of March eighteen hundred and twenty eight and 13th day of Feb^y 1829,

do give, grant, convey and confirm, and by these presents, in behalf of said Commonwealth, have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto William Warren of Olive, in the County of Ulster and State of New-York, formerly a private soldier in the First Massachusetts regiment

who enlisted as a Soldier into the American Army to serve during the revolutionary War with Great Britain, and who was returned as a part of the Massachusetts quota of said Army, and who did actually serve in said Army the full term of three years, and was honorably discharged, and to his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, and interest of said Commonwealth, in and unto a lot of land numbered eight and nine in the fourth range situate and lying in a township, in the County of Somerset in the State of Maine, numbered four in the same range of township, north of Bangsboro Penobscot Purchase

said lot contains two hundred acres, bounded North by lot number eight & nine of the fifth range, East by lot N^o 10 of the fourth range, South by lot N^o 8 & 9 of the third range, and westerly by lot N^o 7 of the fourth range

according to a plan of the survey of said township made by Ebenezer Coburn in the month of November eighteen hundred and eighteen and will more fully appear on reference being had to said plan now on file in the Land Office.

To Have and to Hold the aforegranted premises to the said William Warren his heirs and assigns, to his and their use and behoof forever. IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal this thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty one

I William Warren of the County and State
aforesaid, aged about sixty seven years do upon oath
testify and declare that in the autumn of the year
one thousand seven hundred and seventy five I en-
listed into the army of the American Revolution
at Oxbridge in the State of Massachusetts, in the
Regiment commanded by Col^o Patterson in the Line
of the State of Massachusetts, for the Term of one
Year. That before the expiration of the said term
of ~~three~~ ^{one} years I again enlisted at Tyconderoga
in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Picaton
and in the Line aforesaid for the Term of
during the War and that I continued in the
service aforesaid until the close of the War
when I was regularly discharged at Snake
Hill near Newburgh in the State of New York
from the company commanded by ~~Colonel~~ ^{Capt}
Hobby in the Regiment commanded by ~~Colonel~~
Mellon in the Line of the State of Massachu-
setts and while I was a Private I do further
declare that I have been found entitled to
pay by the Secretary of the Treasury of the
United States under the act of Congress of
May 13th 1828 That my Discharge is either
lost or destroyed so that I cannot produce
it in corroboration of the above Statement
I further declare that I have never received
the Land promised to me on the part of
the Commonwealth of Massachusetts nor
have I ever assigned or transferred my claim
thereto in any manner whatsoever Therefore

I now all men by these presents
That I William Warren aforesaid do hereby

constitute and appoint Lewis Wakeley of Grunkille in the State of New York to be my true and lawful Attorney for me in my name to demand and receive from the Land Agent of the State of Massachusetts a Title Deed or Patent for the quantity of Land due to me as aforesaid and my said Attorney is hereby fully authorized & empowered to receive any Commutation for said Land which he shall deem fit and proper and to do and transact all manner of business in relation to the procuring of the said Land or Commutation which shall appear him fit or convenient And my said Attorney is hereby fully empowered to constitute and appoint one or more substitutes under him for the special purposes above expressed
