have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto *Joshua Davis of Brookville*
in the County of Hancock and State of Maine, Esquire,
Assignee of Daniel Webber, deceased, formerly a Sergeant
in the second Massachusetts regiment commanded
by Colonel Bailey — — — — —
who enlisted as a Soldier into the American Army to serve during the revolutionary War
with Great Britain, and who was returned as a part of the Massachusetts quota of said
Army, and who did actually serve in said Army the full term of three years, and was hon-
orably discharged, and to his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, and interest of said
Commonwealth, in and unto a lot of land numbered *Three*

situate and lying in a township, in the County
of *Pendecot* in the State of Maine, numbered *two* in the
seventh range of townships, west of the east line
of said State

said lot contains two hundred acres, bounded *on the north by lot number*
four, On the east by the town line, On the south
by lot number two. And on the west by lot number
fifteen.

and that I will warrant and Defend the same Promises to the
said Joshua Davis his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful
Claims and Demands of all Persons

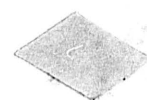
Know all men by these presents, that I Joshua Davis of Brooksville

lawful attorney for me & in my name, as the representative ^{of} ~~of~~ Daniel
Webber, late of said Brooksville, Gentleman, deceased, to draw
& receive a Deed of a lot of land containing two hundred acres
from the lands appropriated by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
by resolve of March 1801 & subsequent resolves, for the benefit
of certain Soldiers of the army of the Revolution; with full
power to make & substitute one or more Attornies under my said
Attorney, & the same again at pleasure to revoke -
