consideration of the sum of One hundred & fifty  
Dollars to me in hand paid by George W. Coffin  
I do hereby give grant bargain sell and convey unto  
Abner Coburn of Bloomfield in the State of Maine  
all the right title & interest which the heirs of Asa  
Woodworth have in and unto the land situated in  
the within deed and do hereby assign the same  
accordingly

**Know all Men by these Presents, THAT**

I whose name is undersigned I seal hereunto affixed  
appointed an AGENT by the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to make  
and execute conveyances, agreeably to a resolve of said Court passed *the seventeenth*  
*day of June eighteen hundred and twenty*  
and pursuant to  
resolves of said Court passed *the fourth day of March eighteen*  
*hundred and twenty-eight, eighteenth day of*  
*February eighteen hundred and twenty-nine,*  
*and eighteenth day of February eighteen hun-*  
*dred and thirty-one*

do give, grant, convey and confirm, and by these presents, in behalf of said Commonwealth,  
have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto *the heirs of Asa Wood,*  
*worth, formerly a private soldier in the seventh*  
*Massachusetts regiment, commanded by Col.*  
*Brooks*

who enlisted as a Soldier into the American Army to serve during the revolutionary War  
with Great Britain, and who was returned as a part of the Massachusetts quota of said  
Army, and who did actually serve in said Army the full term of three years, and was hon-  
orably discharged, and to his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, and interest of said  
Commonwealth, in and unto a lot of land numbered *Ten and Eleven in the*  
*seventh range of lots* situate and lying in a township, in the County  
of *Somerset* in the State of *Maine*, *numbered four of the*  
*second range of townships, north of Bangs*  
*Remond's Purchase*

said lot contains two hundred acres, bounded *on the north by lots number*  
*ten and eleven of the eighth range, on the east by lot*  
*number twelve of the seventh range, on the south*  
*by lots number ten and eleven of the sixth range and*  
*on the west by lot number nine of the seventh range*  
according to a plan of the survey of said township made by *Oliver Coburn*  
in the month of *Autumn* of *eighteen hundred and eighteen*  
and will more fully appear on reference being had to said plan now on file in  
the Land Office.

**To Have and to Hold** the aforegranted premises to the said *Asa Wood*  
*and his heirs and assigns* his heirs and assigns, to his and their use  
and behoof forever. IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my  
seal this *sixth* day of *July* in the year of our Lord eighteen  
hundred and *thirty-two*

of my knowledge and belief Asa Woodworth aforesaid  
about or in the year 1777 entered or enlisted  
into the Army of the American Revolution for the  
Term of During the War and That he served in the  
Seventh Regiment of Massachusetts Infantry com-  
manded by Colonel Brooks; And That he contin-  
ued in the Service aforesaid until the close of  
the War when he was regularly discharged from  
The said Regiment of Massachusetts Infantry com-  
manded by Colonel Brooks I further declare that I have  
seen the discharge of <sup>the</sup> said Asa Woodworth

I further declare that the said Asa Woodworth died at  
Cincinnati in the State of Ohio about or in the year  
1795 and that to my knowledge he has never received  
a Certificate or Deed for the quantity of Land prom-  
ised to him on the part of the Commonwealth of Massa-  
chusetts or any Commutation therefor

Therefore know all  
Men by these presents that I James Woodworth aforesaid  
do hereby constitute and appoint Lewis Wakeley to be my  
true and lawful Attorney for me and in my name  
to to select from the Tract appropriated by the Common-  
wealth of Massachusetts such Lot or Lots of Land as shall  
appear unto him fit and proper, And in name of the  
heirs of the said Asa Woodworth to receive from the Land  
Agent of the State a Title or Deed thereof In Testimony  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this

12 day of April 1832
