I William Vance of Newfield in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine, aged years, do, upon oath declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I enlisted in the year 1775 for 7 months in Windsor regt & in 1776 for one year into Phinney regt and in 1777 for three years into Lane Cosby & Alden regt of the Maple line in the army of the Revolution & served fully the three years under honorable discharge at West Point in the year 1780 & am now upon the U. States Pension roll of the Maine Agency

I do further on oath declare that at the time of my said enlistment, I was an inhabitant of the State of Massachusetts

and was on the 17th day of March, 1835, have been ever since, and am now an inhabitant of the State of Maine, residing in Newfield aforesaid, where I have resided for Sevent years past. That neither I, nor any one claiming under me, has ever received a grant of Land, or money in lieu thereof, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for my said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am justly entitled to the benefit of said Resolve.
