I Margaret Warren of Hiram in the County of
Oxford State of Maine aged ^{seventy five} years do
upon oath declare in order to obtain the
benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine
passed March 17. 1835 "entitled a Resolve
in favour of certain Officers & Soldiers of
the Revolutionary War, and Widows of deceased
Officers and Soldiers" that I am the widow
of Nathaniel Warren late of Hiram in the County
of Oxford & State of Maine, who died at
Hiram on the fourth day of August AD 1819
That I have reason to believe and do fully
believe that my said husband, enlisted in the
Revolutionary War on or about 1777 for the term
of three years which term he served

I do further an oath declare that I have
reason to believe and do fully believe that my
said late husband was at the
time of his said enlistment an inhabitant
of the Town of Scarborough and I do
know that he was at the time of his decease
an owner and an inhabitant of the State of Maine
residing in Hiram aforesaid where he had
resided for three years before his decease that
I have reason to believe and do fully believe
that neither my said late husband nor
any one claiming under him did receive
(nor have I received since his decease)
a grant of Land or money in lieu thereof
from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for his
said service or any other service during the Revolutionary
War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the
benefit of said Resolve.

Maine being the same person by whom
the foregoing declaration was made do hereby

of the State of Maine such Certificate as may
be issued to me in virtue of a Resolve of
said State passed March 17. 1835 entitled a
Resolve in favour of certain Officers & Soldiers
of the Revolutionary War, & the Widows of
deceased Officers & Soldiers to the benefit of said
Resolve I am entitled, and my said attorney
is hereby authorized and empowered upon
Receipt of said Certificate for me and in my
name to execute such Receipt or Acknowledgment
therefor as I may think proper & personally present.

Commonwealth of Massachusetts, County of Bristol, ss. On this 11th day of May, A.D. 1818, before me the Subscriber Judge of the Court of Probate in said County, and Just Associate Justice of the Circuit Court of Common Pleas for the First Eastern Circuit in said Commonwealth, personally appeared Nathaniel Warren aged about sixty one years a Resident of Hiram in said County, who being by me first duly sworn according to Law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late Act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land or naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," that he the said Nathaniel Warren served in the Revolutionary War on the Continental Establishment against the Common enemy about Three years; that he enlisted at Scarborough Maine for three years on the 9th day of December A.D. 1777 into the Company Commanded by Capt Hastings attached to Col. Henry Jackson's Regiment, being the 16th in Massachusetts Line, in which Company, & Regt. And the last year in Stark's Brigade he served out said three years, and on the 19th day of December A.D. 1780 at West Point was regularly discharged, which discharge is herewith annexed & that he is the identical person therein named that he is reduced in his circumstances and stands in need of assistance from his Country for support, that he has no other evidence of his services now in his power. Sworn to and declared before me the day and year aforesaid.

I the Subscriber Judge &c. do aforesaid do certify that it appears to my satisfaction that the said Nathaniel Warren did serve in the Revolutionary War on the Continental Establishment against the Common enemy for the term of nine months, and that the said Nathaniel Warren is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of his Country for support, and I now transmit the proceedings and testimony taken and had before me to the Hon. Secretary for the Department of War pursuant to the directions of the aforementioned Act of Congress. In testimony whereof I have herewith set my hand and affixed the seal of the said Court at Fryeburg on the twelfth day of August A.D. 1818
