I John Merrill of Berston in the County of York in the State of Maine 70 years of age an Oath devisor that I have been Intimately acquainted with John Woodman of Berston in the County of York from my Childhood until his Decease which was on the 18th day of November 1828. I further state that I lived during that term within 100 Rods of his Residence in the Year of 1795. Said Woodman Enlisted in the Revolutionary War in a Company Commanded by Capt. John Eiden of Berston in said County he then Marched to ~~Danvers~~ Danchester and Toured 2 months ^{a James Thompson's Regiment} then Returned home and Enlisted in a Company Commanded by Capt. Daniel Lane for the term of three years. Said Woodman Enlisted as a Sergeant but when he arrived to Albany he Entered in to the Commissary department and Continued in that Capacity until he Completed the said term of three years and Was Honorably discharge at east town in the State of Pennsylvania he then Returned home to the place of his former Residence

In the State of Maine 75 Years of age do Rath
declair I have been acquainted ^{with} John Woodman of
Buxton in the County of York Deceased Sometime in
the Year of 1777 Said Woodman Enlisted in a Company
Commanded by Capt Daniel Lane of Buxton for the
term of three years and I belonged to the same Company
in one Oliver's Regiment who was killed at Cherry Valley
in the State of New York by the Indians. Said Woodman
Enlisted as a Sargeant but when he arrived to New York
at Albany he seen duty as a Commacerry and continued
in that Capacity untill he was discharged at Easttown
in the State of Pennsylvania and I have been intimately
acquainted with him from that time untill his decease
which ~~was~~ ^{he} was on the 18 day of Nov^r 1828.
