The bearer, my son, will call at your Office, and I shall feel obliged to you if you will send me by him a little information as to the mode of application by Revolutionary Soldiers for their lands under the late Resolves. The declaration I suppose may be made before a Justice of the Peace, and not in Court. Have you a list prepared of those entitled, or do you look up individual cases as they are presented. If the names are found on the rolls I suppose it saves all trouble & expense of furnishing other evidence. I wish you to be good enough to forward me one of the blank declarations usually made by the soldier. There are a few in this neighborhood who wish me to attend for them — any suggestion that you think of further, I shall be glad for you to make.

I send a small list of soldiers who have drawn pensions on declaration of three years service. Can you without much trouble inform me whether their names so appear on any documents in your possession, as to save the necessity of further evidence to support the declaration they may make.

Sir,

I herewith enclose the Declarations of Levi Hutchins of Alfred and Caleb Lassell of Waterborough, and also, of Betsey Hutchins the widow of Eastman Hutchins late of Alfred, deceased, wherein they claim the benefit of the Resolves of March 17<sup>th</sup> 1835. I have annexed to the declaration of Mrs. Hutchins the necessary certificate of the Judge of Probate.

You will perceive that Mr. Levi Hutchins and Mr. Lassell served in the Army together, and each corroborates the statements of the other, and both testify to the service of Eastman Hutchins deceased, the former husband of Mrs. B. Hutchins. I presume their declarations with the accompanying evidence will be sufficient to establish their claims. Indeed their own declarations would be satisfactory to establish their claims where they are known. I have been acquainted with Mr. Lassell & Mr. L. Hutchins for 15 yrs and can state that they are men of veracity, and their statements are entitled to full credit; so far as their memories remain unimpaired. And they seem to have the most perfect recollection of the prominent events of their Revolutionary campaigns.

I hope the evidence will be satisfactory, as they are poor and wish to incur as little expense as possible in proving their claims to the bounty of the State - which they are justly entitled to beyond doubt.

But if any thing further is necessary, will you have the goodness to inform me, and I will endeavor to furnish it.

The certificates when granted may be enclosed to me.
