Hancock ss.—To the Sheriff of our said county of *Hancock* or either of the
Deputies, or the Constables of the town of *Sebec* within said county, or to
any or either of them, GREETING.

IN the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to attach the
goods or estate of *George Doughty of Sebec in said county*
of Hancock, Yeoman.

to the value of twenty dollars; and for want thereof, to take the body of the said *George*
if he may be found in your precinct and him safely keep so that he may be had
before me, *Noses Freeman* Esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace for the county aforesaid
at my dwelling-house, in *Williamstown* in said county, on *Saturday* the *twenty*
fifth day of *March* 1815 at *ten* of the clock in the
fore noon: then and there to answer unto *Benjamin Bowman of Fairfield*
alias Waterville in an county of Kennebec, Yeoman.

in a plea of the case, for that the said *George* at said
on the day of the purchase of this writ, being indebted to the plaintiff in the sum of
dollars and *cents*, according to the account annexed; then and there, in consideration
thereof, promised the plaintiff to pay him the same sum on demand.

Also for that the said *Doughty* at *Waterville* on
the *third* day of *August* in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and *seven* by his note of hand, of that date, by him signed for value received,
promised the plaintiff to pay him or his order, *within eighty days after date* the sum of
six dollars, and *interest* *cents*,

Yet, though often requested said *Doughty* hath never paid
said sum, nor any, or either of them, but neglects and refuses to do it.

To the damage of the said plaintiff as he says the sum of twenty dollars, as shall then and there
appear, with other due damages.—Hereof fail not and make due return of this writ and of your doings
therein, to myself at or before the said time and day of trial.

in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *fifteen*
