COUNTY OF PENOBSCOT, ss. At a Circuit Court of Common Pleas, begun and holden at Bangor within and for said County of the fourth Tuesday of June 1820

ON this 27 day of June in the year

of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty, personally appeared in open court, being a court of record within and for said County and State of Maine, established by a law of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, made and passed on the eleventh day of June, A. D. 1811, and recognized by the Constitution of the State of Maine

aged, Sixty years, resident in Bangor

in said County of Penobscot, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: Viz, in the company

commanded by Captain William Bent and in the Regiment commanded by Colonel - Quater James June until December 1775 - In the year 1775 - On the first of January 1776 - I enlisted for one year and served under this rank Captain & Colonel as before mentioned, in the Massachusetts line upon the Continental establishment, during this whole of said year 1776 - and was honourably discharged - I fought during this year in Arnold's battle on Lake Champlain and in a skirmish at Amberg - In 1777 - I enlisted into the Massachusetts line and served under Colquell - Nichols and was in both engagements at Brimington and was honourably discharged - In 1779 I served eight months at Rhode Island -

In the Spring of 1780 I again enlisted and served in the company commanded by Captain - Stone in the Regiment commanded by Colonel - Mendenhall of the Massachusetts line upon the Continental establishment for the term of nine months at this expiration of which time I was honourably discharged - All which is set forth more at large in my original declaration made on the fourth day of April 1820. on which declaration my certificate of pension numbered 14,227 was granted -

Schedule of the family residing with me Jesse Smith who was by occupation an husbandman which I was unable to pursue, having nearly lost the use of my right foot and being afflicted with Hemoid

do solemnly swear, that I was

a resident citizen of the United States on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner whatever, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me: nor have I any income, other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed.
