before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Third Eastern Circuit, of the Court of Common Pleas, in said Commonwealth, including the Counties of Hancock, Washington and Penobscot : Personally appeared *Samuel Stickney* who, being by me first duly sworn according to law, on his oath made the statement and declaration by him subscribed, and hereto annexed, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the revolutionary war."

And thereupon, I the said Judge do certify that I am satisfied the said *Samuel* did serve in the revolutionary war, as stated in his said declaration, against the common enemy, and that he has made it appear to me, that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support.

Which proceedings and the testimony annexed, being all he has been able to produce, I now transmit to the Secretary, for the department of War, pursuant to the directions of the aforementioned act of Congress.

I Samuel Stickney of Brownville Plantation, in the County
of Providence on oath do hereby testify & say that
on or about the month of January 1776 I enlisted into the
service of the Revolutionary war for two months in Cap.
M^r. Rogers Company: I was stationed at Prospect Hill: I served this
time out & was regularly discharged: On or about the month
of May of the same year I enlisted again for two months in
Capt. Howels Company Col Titcomb's Reg^t. I joined my Reg^t. at
Providence: I served my said term out at that place & was
regularly discharged: At the time of the French Fleet lying
at Rhoad Island, I enlisted again for six months, at the
time of Sullivan's expedition: in Capt. Lewis's Company, and
afterwards in Capt. Brown's Company: Col. Titcomb's Reg^t.
I served my time out at that place & was regularly disch^d
=arged: This I think was in 1778 — In the Spring of 1780
according to my recollection, I enlisted again for nine
months in Capt. Lewis's Company, Col. Vases Reg^t. Lewis's
Brigade: I joined my Reg^t. at Tatamag near West Point —
I served this time out at this place & West Point: I was
regularly discharged at this last place: About the time
that Cornwallis was captured I enlisted again for six
months, in Capt. Londs Company (I think) Col. Wades Reg^t.
I joined my Reg^t. at Rhoad Island: I served out my P. term
at this place. I was regularly discharged, being about the
close of the War: I have lost all my P. discharges: I
am now under reduced circumstances, & need the
assistance of my Country for support.
